Summary of ARC's 2024-25 Academic Year Program

Rising Community Leadership (RCL) Program

The Rising Community Leadership (RCL) Program provides opportunities for 9th grade students to practice identity exploration, community-building, and self expression within the College and Career Readiness class at North Tahoe High School. Students in this program met weekly for an hour and a half and participated in group activities, partner sharing, independent journaling, and vocabulary building, which culminated in the writing and presentation of an biographical poem.

ARC spent 16 class periods with 17 students in the RCL program at NTHS. This included 333.5 student contact hours over the first semester.


Lunch Club

Community Leadership (CL) Program

The Community Leadership (CL) Program is tailored to support the transference and deepening of learning from the immersive ARC summer course. Students receive a \$1000 scholarship upon high school graduation when they complete the five components of the program: student-led outdoor experience, Wilderness First Aid and CPR certification, ARC leadership day for 8th grade students, monthly mentoring, and writing and presenting a final speech.
